We are performing a statewide audit of the Magistrates. During our review, we conducted certain audit procedures, as we deemed appropriate.

Management is an important part of the Magistrates' accountability, since you are responsible for establishing and maintaining internal controls and complying with applicable laws and regulations. During our review, we noted certain matters that required management's attention and corrective action. These matters included:

Promptly Record Manual Receipts

The magistrates did not record manual receipts in the E-Mag system promptly. Delayed entry of manual activity into the automated system poses an increased risk for loss or misappropriation of funds. The Chief Magistrate should monitor all manual receipt activity to ensure the timeliness of entry into the automated system.

Promptly Deposit Funds

Seven magistrates deposited cash bonds totaling \$17,500 up to five days after receipt instead of the next business day as directed by the <u>Magistrate's Manual</u>. Not depositing cash into the bank promptly increases the risk of loss of funds. Magistrates should deposit all funds into the Magistrate's official checking account within one day of receipt as required.
