LETTER FROM THE CHAIR

March 7, 1934 marked a decisive moment in Virginia history, when in response to the repeal of Prohibition, the General Assembly voted to adopt a "liquor control plan," creating the Virginia Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control (ABC). While much has changed in 75 years, Virginia ABC remains committed to providing excellent customer service, enhancing public safety and maximizing revenue returned to the Commonwealth.

ABC's 75th anniversary has resulted in print, radio and television news and talk show segments on ABC history and the agency's current initiatives. A community event "commemorating the oldest ABC store to remain in its original location in Clifton Forge and a display of historical artifacts at the Library of Virginia added to the anniversary year. ABC store posters inform customers that the agency has contributed more than \$6 billion to Virginia's General Fund since the first stores opened in 1934.

ABC completed Fiscal Year 2009 with a record \$665.6 million in annual gross sales. Although slightly below forecast, sales increased by 3.8 percent over last year. Retail dollars are up 5.2 percent while mixed beverage licensee sales continue to lag with a 1.5 percent decrease.

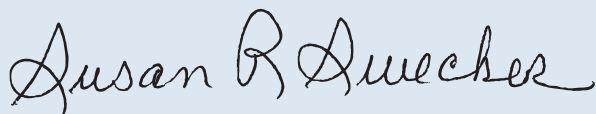
Due to the tough economy, ABC is doing more with less and developing new ways to enhance performance. The launching of ABC gift cards before the holiday season in the agency's 332 stores boosted fiscal year sales by \$284,100. New SpaceMan software for shelf management offers planogram-driven shelf configurations using category leaders for anchors. More than 90 percent of store employees have taken and passed the newly launched Internet-based product-knowledge training modules for all distilled spirits categories.

The newest education/prevention efforts include alcoholic energy drink awareness, alcohol and aging awareness and a military outreach initiative on alcohol education. The National Conference of State Liquor Administrators (NCSLA) presented a Best Practice Award for Community Collaboration in Health and Safety to ABC for its military initiative, which has expanded to include a Military Safe Rides Home Program in Hampton Roads.

Training/compliance efforts include "Ask 4 ID," a four-minute online training video for sellers and servers, assisting them with recognizing underage driver's licenses. ABC sent "Ask 4 ID" posters and stickers to more than 15,000 licensed establishments. The campaign coincides with the issuing of newly designed driver's licenses with enhanced security features.

ABC is being recognized as an example of environmental sustainability with its increased emphasis on "going green." Last year, ABC recycled 364 tons of cardboard, 18 tons of shrink-wrap and 44 tons of office paper. ABC received E2 certification by the Virginia Environmental Excellence Program and the agency is currently pursuing E3 certification. The agency's latest efforts include coordinating with the licensee community about environmentally friendly procedures that can reduce waste, conserve energy and save money.

In this 75th anniversary year, ABC remains committed to the public safety of Virginia's citizens, providing alcohol education for people of all ages; excellent customer service at each of our retail locations; and generating a consistent source of revenue for some of the commonwealth's most important programs.

The 2009 session of the Virginia General Assembly once again dealt with a wide range of issues relating to alcoholic beverages. From alcoholic energy drinks to zoning issues affecting farm wineries, almost 40 alcohol-related measures were considered by the legislators. Less than half of these measures actually survived to become law. The following are among the more significant.

- PILOT PROJECT.** After a year of study by subcommittees of the House Committee on General Laws and the Senate Committee on Rehabilitation and Social Services, legislation was passed to create a pilot project to evaluate an alternative method for measuring the level of food sales required for mixed beverage licensees. Under existing law, mixed beverage licensees must annually sell an amount of food and non-alcoholic beverages equal to at least 45 percent of the total of such food and non-alcoholic beverages sales and mixed beverage sales. Some licensees have suggested that consumers are ordering more expensive spirits drinks, requiring additional food sales despite no increase in alcohol volume. The pilot project will peg food sales requirements to the amount of alcohol purchased, rather than the dollar values of mixed drinks sold. During the two-year voluntary project, participating licensees will satisfy the food sales requirement by either meeting the existing 45 percent ratio or selling at least \$350 of food and non-alcoholic beverages for each proof gallon of spirits purchased from the Board during the license year. A proof gallon is one gallon of 100 proof spirits. ABC will report its findings and any recommendations based upon the results of the project to the General Assembly on or before July 1, 2011.
- NEW REGULATIONS.** The Alcoholic Beverage Control Board will be promulgating new regulations in two areas as a result of legislative action: (1) Two identical bills, House Bill 2051 and Senate Bill 1258, were enacted which require the Board to establish a schedule of offenses for which penalties may be waived upon a showing that the licensee has had no prior violations within five years immediately preceding the date of the violation. This waiver will not be granted for a licensee's willful and knowing violation of statutes or Board regulations. (2) Energy drinks containing alcohol are addressed by House Bill 2597. This statute calls upon the Board to promulgate a regulation that requires off-premises retail licensees to place any premixed energy drink containing one-half of one percent or more alcohol by volume in the same location in the store where beer and wine are made available for sale within the licensed premises.
- STATE FAIR.** The State Fair of Virginia moved into its new home at the Meadow Farm Event Park in 2009, and in preparation for the opening of the new venue, the General Assembly passed Senate Bill 1414, adding the ability for certain non-profit organizations owning a "rural event and entertainment park" to receive an annual mixed beverage special events license. In its previous location, the Fair obtained one-day special event licenses for any event involving the sale of alcoholic beverages. The new legislation allows the issuance of a permanent annual license to cover all the events at the park, in lieu of many individual ones.
- WINE-OF-THE-MONTH CLUBS.** Licensed wine or beer shippers operating "wine-of-the-month" or "beer-of-the-month" clubs will now be able to solicit and receive applications for subscriptions away from their licensed places of business. As a general rule, licensees must sell wine or beer at their licensed premises. Some "wine-of-the-month" club operators wanted to be able to conduct sale transactions at wine festivals or other locations away from their licensed location. Senate Bill 1445 will now allow the holder of a wine shipper license or beer shipper license to solicit and receive applications for subscription to a "wine-of-the-month" or "beer-of-the-month" club at locations for which a license allowing on-premises consumption has been granted.
- CARBONATED SPIRITS.** A major distiller found itself with a product with limited marketability to restaurants, leading to the introduction of House Bill 2052 and Senate

Bill 983. The Code of Virginia provides that mixed beverage licensees may not deliver to a consumer an original bottle of alcoholic beverages, except for hotel room service and the Korean spirit soju. The new product is carbonated, and restaurants found that the product lost its carbonation after opening. They were reluctant to stock the item to pour individual drinks, since the product remaining in the bottle after the first drink was poured might spoil before it was sold. The new legislation allows the delivery to consumers of spirits in the original container as long as the container is no larger than 375 milliliters, the alcohol content is no greater than 15 percent by volume, and the contents are carbonated and perishable.

- **PUBLIC SAFETY THREATS AT LICENSED PREMISES.** Prior to 2008, a statute authorized the Board to suspend or revoke a license if the licensee operated a “disorderly” establishment. A federal court decision finding the term “disorderly” unconstitutionally vague led the General Assembly to repeal the challenged provision. This left ABC with limited ability to address persistent public safety issues occurring at licensed premises. House Bill 2523 addresses this issue. It authorizes the Board to suspend or revoke a license if the licensee has failed to prevent the licensed premises or his property or public property immediately adjacent to the licensed premises from becoming a place where patrons arrested for certain criminal violations that are so frequent and serious as to be deemed a continuing threat to public safety.
- **AFFIRMATIVE DEFENSE.** In 2006, the General Assembly passed an amendment to §4.1-200 of the Code of Virginia, providing that alcoholic beverages could be served or given to persons under the age of 21 years at someone’s residence, provided the underage recipient was accompanied by a parent, guardian, or spouse who is 21 years of age or older. There is a cross-reference to this provision in the statute prohibiting consumption of alcoholic beverages by persons under 21, creating an exception to the consumption prohibition for the home with parent situation. Some courts in the Commonwealth interpreted these provisions to require that whenever an underage person was charged with underage consumption, the Commonwealth had a burden to prove beyond a reasonable doubt that the underage consumer did not consume at a residence in the presence of a parent, guardian, or spouse of age. House Bill 2627 clarifies the situation by making the exception an affirmative defense. The intent is that the Commonwealth does not have to prove the defendant did not drink at home, but the defendant can attempt to prove such consumption in his defense.
- **IGNITION INTERLOCK.** A great deal of discussion in legislative committees this year dealt with the proposed expansion of the requirement that certain persons convicted of driving under the influence of alcohol equip their motor vehicles with an ignition interlock system. With ignition interlock, the driver has to provide a breath sample before starting the car, and the ignition will not engage upon the detection of alcohol. Existing law required courts to order ignition interlock installation for persons convicted of a second offense of DUI within five years. There were proposals to require an interlock for all offenders, but ultimately Senate Bill 1463 was adopted, which extends the ignition interlock requirement to all those convicted of a second offense within ten years of the first offense.
- **LOCAL REGULATION OF FARM WINERY ACTIVITIES.** There has been a continuing discussion at the General Assembly in recent years concerning the proper level of local government control over activities at Virginia farm wineries. In 2006, the legislature adopted what is now §15.2-2288.3 of the Code of Virginia, expressing the policy of the Commonwealth with respect to the use of local land use authority to regulate farm winery activities. The statute was amended in 2007 to list certain farm winery activities not subject to local regulation. This year’s House Bill 2071 and Senate Bill 1033 were identical pieces of legislation which now require that local restriction on farm winery activities must take into account “the agricultural nature of such activities and events.”

The financial statements of the agency are audited annually by the Auditor of Public Accounts as required by the Code of Virginia. The Auditor of Public Accounts is part of the legislative branch of Virginia government and reports through the Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission (JLARC) of the General Assembly. This structure provides independence from the executive and judicial branch agencies they audit. ■

Management's Discussion and Analysis

(UNAUDITED)

This discussion and analysis of the Virginia Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control's (ABC) financial performance provides a brief overview of financial activities for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2009.

FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS

- The Department's operating revenues increased 3.6% in Fiscal Year 2009, due in part to the continued expansion of the retail store network and national trends for increased distilled spirit consumption.
- ABC operations returned record profits to the Commonwealth in Fiscal Year 2009 of \$111.8 million.
- Three new stores were opened throughout Fiscal Year 2009 generating \$2.2 million in additional sales. Five stores were relocated to improved market areas and ten were remodeled.
- As a result of HB1314 passed by the 2004 session of the General Assembly, the Board was allowed to operate on Sundays. Five additional localities were added to Sunday sales with the passing of HB908 in 2008. Fiscal Year 2009 ended with a total of 133 Stores operating on Sundays. The total Sunday sales for Fiscal Year 2009 reached \$18.4 million, an increase of \$5.8 million from Fiscal Year 2008 to Fiscal Year 2009.

OVERVIEW OF FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

The audited annual report consists of a series of proprietary fund financial statements. The Statement of Net Assets provides information about the Department's assets and liabilities and reflects the financial position as of June 30, 2009. The Statement of Revenues, Expenses, and Changes in Net Assets reports the operating revenue activity and the expenses related to such activity for the twelve-month period ended June 30, 2009. The Statement of Cash Flows outlines the cash inflows and outflows relating to the operations for the same twelve-month period. The financial statements also include "notes" that provide additional information that is essential to a full understanding of the data provided in the statements. These statements provide current and noncurrent information about the Department's financial position.

FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

- ABC ended Fiscal Year 2009 with a total of \$54.6 million in current assets including \$45.8 million in inventory of alcohol merchandise for resale, a \$2.0 million increase. The increase in inventory is a result of 3 new stores being opened in Fiscal Year 2009. New products being introduced in the market and vendor price increases to ABC also impacts the value of ABC inventory.
- The change in Net Capital Assets from Fiscal Year 2008 to Fiscal Year 2009 is due to the following factors: \$0.5 million of depreciation related to the change in the useful life of a vehicle, the write-off of carpet, furniture, fixtures as fixed assets \$1.6 million and other annual depreciation of \$4.0 million.
- In total, assets decreased from \$66.8 million in Fiscal Year 2008 to \$63.6 million in Fiscal Year 2009.

- Total Liabilities decreased from last fiscal year end. Current liabilities owed by the Department decreased \$2.3 million from last fiscal year. The liability amount is largely represented in accounts payable as well as payments due to the Commonwealth for line of credit repayment, taxes payable (see Note 4) and the undistributed balance of profits. Noncurrent liabilities netted a slight decrease due to the normal scheduled monthly payments according to the Master Equipment Leasing Program (MELP) through the Department of Treasury used to obtain the point of sale cash registers and software in Fiscal Years 2002 and 2003 plus the \$3.7 million MELP increase in Fiscal Years 2006 and 2007 to finance a portion of the new warehouse racking system (see Note 6).
- The Department lacks working capital (current assets in excess of current liabilities) to fund all business needs at year-end including accelerated payments of taxes and profits before June 30. Given this periodic lack of necessary working capital, the Department depends on a \$60 million line of credit with the State Comptroller to meet day-to-day operations. At June 30, 2009, the amount borrowed was \$28,109,858 (see Note 4).
- ABC's gross margin on alcohol (percent of revenue including state tax on sales left after subtracting cost of goods sold and state tax on sales) increased to 35.0% in Fiscal Year 2009 from 34.2% in Fiscal Year 2008.

REVENUE: The vast majority of the Department's revenues come from the sale of alcoholic beverages. These revenues are achieved through the 330+ state-run stores located throughout the state. Gross sales including state tax on sales in Fiscal Year 2009 reached an all time high of \$665 million, up \$24 million over Fiscal Year 2008. The gross revenue after state tax on sales of alcohol increased from \$535.5 million to \$555.8 million or 3.8%. License and permit fees remained constant in Fiscal Year 2009 totaling \$11.3 million same as the \$11.3 million in Fiscal Year 2008. Federal grants and contracts receipts as well as miscellaneous revenues were down slightly. Other sources of revenue include lottery, wine wholesalers tax, penalties and mixed beverage taxes on common carriers.

EXPENSES:

In Fiscal Year 2009 operating expenses (not including cost of sales, alcohol and lottery) increased from \$132.8 million to \$138.6 million, an increase of 4.3%. Approximately 70.0% of the Department's total expenses are for the cost of sales of distilled spirits and mixers sold through ABC stores and less than 1% for lottery cost of sales. Following cost of merchandise is personal services, which accounts for 17.1% of total expenses. The remaining 12.7% is made up of contractual services (e.g. store rents), continuous charges (utilities) and other miscellaneous charges. Expenses for personal services, rents and utilities increased in Fiscal Year 2009 in order to support the growth in ABC's sales and profits. Other drivers of expense increases are depreciation, technology, credit card fees and store communications. These trends are expected to continue as the Department strives to open additional new stores.

PROFITS:

Prior to the statutory distribution of quarterly net profits to the General Fund, transfers required in the Appropriation Act for each fiscal year must be executed. In Fiscal Year 2009, approximately \$67.6 million of the agency's \$111.8 million in net profits were transferred to other state agencies. The majority, \$65.4 million, transfers to the Department of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Services incurred for care, treatment, study and rehabilitation of alcoholics. The remaining \$46.4 million was distributed to local governments and the General Fund in accordance with the Code of Virginia.

ECONOMIC FACTORS AND NEXT YEAR'S BUDGET

- During Fiscal Year 2010, the Department anticipates a significant decrease in the growth rate in sales. Because of the stagnant economy, the Department is currently forecasting a 2.9% increase in sales to \$685 million, the lowest growth rate since the late 1990's.
- ABC's expenses continue to increase, largely because of escalating store rents and the impact of planned technology upgrades such as point of sale replacement that is required to meet the security standards of the Payment Card Industry. ABC expects a significant increase in depreciation as these projects reach their conclusion in 2010.
- Presently, the Appropriations Act requirement for ABC profits is \$104.7 million for Fiscal Year 2010. While ABC expects to exceed this amount, the greatest risk to reaching the profit requirements are sluggish sales, particularly during the holiday sales season.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

AS OF JUNE 30, 2009

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

A. Reporting Entity

The Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control administers ABC laws with an emphasis on public service and a focus on public safety by ensuring a safe, orderly, and regulated system for convenient distribution and responsible consumption of alcoholic beverages while generating a reasonable profit for the Commonwealth and its localities.

A separate report is prepared for the Commonwealth of Virginia, which includes all agencies, boards, commissions, and authorities over which the Commonwealth exercises or has the ability to exercise oversight authority or is the recipient of their services and/or benefits. The Department is an agency of the Commonwealth of Virginia and is included in the Commonwealth of Virginia's Comprehensive Annual Financial Report.

B. Fund Accounting

The activities of the Department are accounted for in an enterprise fund. The enterprise fund is used to account for operations that are financed and operated in a manner similar to private business enterprises where the intent of the governing body is that the costs of providing goods and services to the general public on a continuing basis, including depreciation and amortization, be financed or recovered primarily through user charges.

C. Basis of Accounting

The Department's records are maintained on the accrual basis, with an economic focus, whereby revenues are recognized when earned and expenses are recognized when the liability is incurred.

Operating revenues and expenses include activities related to the sale of alcohol and licenses, as well as enforcement activities. Nonoperating revenues and expenses include activities that have the characteristics of noncapital financing activities, such as the collection of rent, as defined by GASB Statement 9, *Reporting Cash Flows of Proprietary and Nonexpendable Trust Funds and Governmental Entities That Use Proprietary Fund Accounting*, and GASB Statement 34.

The Department has the option to apply all Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) pronouncements issued after November 30, 1989, unless FASB conflicts with GASB. The Department has elected to apply FASB pronouncements issued after the applicable date.

D. Inventories

Merchandise inventory, purchased for resale, is valued at average cost, which is lower than market value.

2. CASH WITH THE TREASURER OF VIRGINIA

All state funds of the Department are held by the Treasurer of Virginia, pursuant to Section 2.2-1800, et. seq., *Code of Virginia*, who is responsible for the collection, disbursement, custody, and investment of state funds. Each fund's equity in pooled state funds is reported as "Cash and Cash Equivalents" on the Statement of Net Assets and is not categorized as to credit risk.

The Department capitalizes all property, plant, and equipment that have a cost or value equal to or greater than \$5,000. Property, plant, and equipment are stated at cost and at the time of acquisition are set up in a comprehensive capital asset system. Depreciation of the cost of property, plant, and equipment is provided on a straight-line basis over their estimated lives of from ten to thirty years on buildings and from three to eight years on equipment.

Change in Estimated Life

The Department changed the estimated life of a vehicle when calculating depreciation from eight years to five years. The result of this change was an additional \$472,045 in depreciation expense for this fiscal year.

Insurance Recovery

An insurance recovery of \$116,311 has been applied for and is expected to be received in Fiscal Year 2010 resulting from fire and water damage to the inventory that occurred in September 2008 at Store Location #68, Harrisonburg, Virginia.

4. DUE TO THE COMMONWEALTH

A. Note Payable

The Department has a line of credit for \$60,000,000 with the Treasurer of Virginia. Repayment is made from revenue collections pursuant to Title 4.1, Chapter 1 of the *Code of Virginia*. As of June 30, 2009, the Department had outstanding \$28,109,858 of its available line of credit to extinguish a cash overdraft.

B. General Fund

The Department collects certain taxes on behalf of the General Fund of the Commonwealth. The state tax on sales is collected from store sales and is paid quarterly to the General Fund of the Commonwealth. The liter tax is collected on wholesalers' direct wine shipments. The 2009 Virginia Acts of Assembly required \$9,886,363 of the gross liter tax to be transferred to the General Fund for expenses incurred for care, treatment, study, and rehabilitation of alcoholics by the Department of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Services and other state agencies. Of the remaining liter tax, twelve percent is retained by the Department and reported as wine wholesalers' tax on the Department's financial statements. The remaining eighty-eight percent is paid to the General Fund of the Commonwealth quarterly. Collections and transfers of state tax on sales and liter tax are not reported on the Statement of Revenues, Expenses, and Changes in Net Assets. Activity relating to the amounts due to the General Fund for the year ended June 30, 2009, is summarized below.

C. Department of Taxation - Sales Tax

The Department collects sales tax on all sales of alcohol and remits collections monthly to the Department of Taxation. Sales tax collections and transfers are not reported on the Statement of Revenues, Expenses, and Changes in Net Assets. D. Earned Surplus

The Appropriation Act, Chapter 781 of the 2009 Acts of Assembly, requires the Department to transfer an estimate of its fourth quarter profits in the month of June. In accordance with the Alcoholic Beverage Control Act, Section §4.1-116 of the *Code of Virginia*, the Department transfers any additional net profit to the General Fund of the Commonwealth 50 days after the last day of the quarter. The Department underestimated profit for the fourth quarter resulting in an additional \$4,154,486 due to the General Fund at June 30, 2009.

5. LEASE COMMITMENTS

The Department is committed under various operating lease agreements for retail store buildings. Rent expense under operating lease agreements amounted to \$19,042,035 for the year. A summary of future obligations under lease agreements as of June 30, 2009, follows.

6. INSTALLMENT NOTES PAYABLE

During Fiscal Years 2005 and 2006 the Department entered into an additional five-year installment purchase agreement for the warehouse racking system. The amount reflects all earned vacation, sick, and compensatory leave payable under the Commonwealth of Virginia's leave payout policies. Information on the Commonwealth's leave payout policies is available at the statewide level in the Commonwealth of Virginia's Comprehensive Annual Financial Report.

8. SECURITIES LENDING TRANSACTIONS

Investments held by the Treasurer of Virginia represent the Department's allocated share of cash collateral received and reinvested and securities received for the State Treasury's securities lending program. Information related to the credit risk of these investments and the State Treasury's securities lending program is available on a statewide level in the Commonwealth of Virginia's Comprehensive Annual Financial Report. The Commonwealth's policy is to record unrealized gains and losses in the General Fund in the Commonwealth's basic financial statements. When gains or losses are realized, the actual gains and losses are recorded by the affected agencies.

9. COLLECTIONS OF MALT BEVERAGE TAX

During the year ended June 30, 2009, the Department collected \$44,582,722 in malt beverage taxes. These funds are deposited by the Department directly with the Treasurer of Virginia for credit to the General Fund of the Commonwealth and are not available to the Department to meet current operating needs and are not included in the financial statements.

10. PENSION PLAN AND OTHER POST RETIREMENT BENEFITS

The employees of the Department are employees of the Commonwealth. The employees participate in a defined benefit plan administered by the Virginia Retirement System (VRS). The VRS also administers life insurance and health related plans for retired employees. Information related to these plans is available on a statewide level only in the Commonwealth of Virginia's Comprehensive Annual Financial Report. The Commonwealth, not the Department, has overall responsibility for contributions to these plans.

11. RISK MANAGEMENT

The Department is exposed to various risks of loss related to torts; theft or, damage to, and destruction of assets; errors and omissions; non-performance of duty; injuries to employees; and natural disasters. The Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control participates in insurance plans maintained by the Commonwealth of Virginia. The state employee health care and worker's compensation plans are administered by the Department of Human Resource Management and the risk management insurance plans are administered by the Department of Treasury, Division of Risk Management. Risk management insurance includes property, general liability, medical malpractice, faithful performance of duty bond, automobile, and air and watercraft plans. The Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control pays premiums to each of these Departments for its insurance coverage. Information relating to the Commonwealth's insurance plans is available at the statewide level in the Commonwealth of Virginia's Comprehensive Annual Financial Report.

12. CONTINGENT LIABILITIES

Legal Proceedings

The Department is named as a party in several legal proceedings. It is not possible at the present time to estimate ultimate outcome or liability, if any, of the Department in respect to the various proceedings; however, it is believed that any ultimate liability resulting from these suits will not have a material, adverse effect on the financial condition of the Department.

Bailment Inventory

The Department houses and controls bailment inventory in the warehouse and is therefore responsible for the exercise of reasonable care to preserve the inventory until it is purchased by the Department or returned to the supplier. The Department uses the bailment system for payment of merchandise for resale. The Department initiates payments to the vendors based on shipments from the ABC warehouse to the retail stores, rather than receipt of invoice from the vendor. At June 30, 2009, the bailment inventory was valued at \$37,822,900.

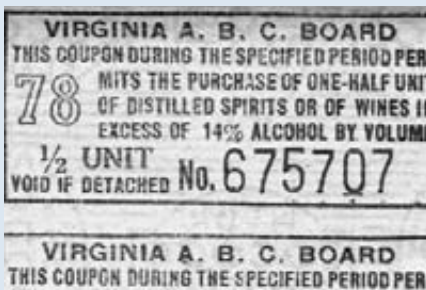

ABC has come a long way since Virginia citizens voted to enact “a plan of liquor control” in 1934

- The Pullman Company received the first ABC license in April 1934 and today there are more than 15,000 licensed establishments in Virginia.
- The first four ABC stores opened in May 1934 and today ABC operates 332 stores statewide, 18 of which are owned, the rest are leased.
- ABC special agents were granted full police powers statewide in 1936; mainly enforcing the laws against bootlegging and moonshining. Today agent duties are wide ranging; from investigating narcotics trafficking to tax embezzlement, in addition to monitoring licensed establishments for compliance with Virginia laws.
- The ABC warehouse moved from Harrison and West Broad Streets in Richmond to its current location at 2901 Hermitage Road in 1971. Recent warehouse automation enables the agency to maintain excellent product service levels. The system is capable of processing 20,000 cases in a normal eight-hour shift.
- In the last 75 years, ABC has contributed more than \$6 billion to the Commonwealth of Virginia's General Fund. In the last five years, ABC has contributed \$1.5 billion. All ABC contributions go directly into the General Fund.

In addition to being a major source of revenue for the Commonwealth, ABC is: a public safety agency enforcing criminal and ABC laws in more than 15,000 licensed establishments; a leader in alcohol education/prevention programs and compliance training for sellers and servers of alcohol; and an administrative hearing agency addressing issues with establishments holding ABC licenses.

While much has changed in the 75 years since its inception, ABC remains committed to providing excellent customer service, enhancing public safety and maximizing revenue returned to the Commonwealth of Virginia.
