We are performing a statewide audit of the Combined General District Courts. During our review of this court, we conducted certain audit procedures, as we deemed appropriate.

Management of this court is an important part of the court's accountability, since you are responsible for establishing and maintaining internal controls and complying with applicable laws and regulations. During our review, we noted certain matters that required management's attention and corrective action. These matters included:

Properly Approve the Reporting of Leave

The Judges do not approve the reporting of leave taken by the Clerk. Instead, the Clerk completes and approves her own leave report. Section 2102.3 of the <u>Human Resources Policy Manual</u> requires the supervising Judges to approve the reporting of the Clerk's leave. Supervisory review and approval is an essential internal control to ensure the accuracy and appropriateness of transactions. Allowing someone to prepare and approve their own leave without a supervisory review can result in both intentional and unintentional errors going undetected. We recommend the supervising Judges immediately begin reviewing and approving the reporting of the Clerk's leave.
