We are performing a statewide audit of the Magistrates. During our review, we conducted certain audit procedures, as we deemed appropriate.

Management is an important part of the Magistrates' accountability since you are responsible for establishing and maintaining internal controls and complying with applicable laws and regulations. During our review, we noted the following matter requiring management's attention and corrective action.

## Follow Established Accounting Procedures Repeat: No

The Chief Magistrate and her staff did not follow established accounting procedures, as outlined in the Office of the Executive Secretary's Magistrate Manual. The magistrates delayed depositing two bonds into the magistrates' bank account but made the corresponding remittance to the applicable courts immediately, causing an overdraft of the magistrates' bank account.

Cash bonds are especially vulnerable to loss and misappropriation. Proper procedures, monitoring, and control are necessary to safeguard collections. The Chief Magistrate and her staff should consistently follow the accounting procedures outlined in the Magistrate Manual, which dictate the magistrates should deposit cash collections by the next business day and should not make the corresponding remittance to the courts until the bank deposit has been made.
