We are performing a statewide audit of the Magistrates. During our review, we conducted certain audit procedures, as we deemed appropriate.

Management is an important part of the Magistrates' accountability, since you are responsible for establishing and maintaining internal controls and complying with applicable laws and regulations. During our review, we noted certain matters that required management's attention and corrective action. These matters included:

## Properly Maintain Accounting Records

The Chief Magistrate does not have adequate internal controls over the financial records prepared by the magistrates. We requested the accounting records of a former magistrate for audit; however, a magistrate had destroyed the accounting records without the Chief's knowledge or approval. The Chief Magistrate is required to retain these records for a period of three years after audit as required by Section 16.1-69.57 of the Code of Virginia. We recommend the Chief Magistrate review the retention schedule of the accounting records with his staff and maintain all of the accounting records in accordance with the Code of Virginia.
