We are performing a statewide audit of the Magistrates. During our review, we conducted certain audit procedures, as we deemed appropriate.

Management is an important part of the Magistrates' accountability, since you are responsible for establishing and maintaining internal controls and complying with applicable laws and regulations. During our review, we noted certain matters that required management's attention and corrective action. These matters included:

## Properly Manage Magistrate Funds

Two Magistrates delayed depositing cash into their official bank account. Specifically we tested 20 receipts and noted five receipts totaling \$5,000 held one day before depositing the cash bonds into their official bank account.

Not depositing cash into the bank promptly is a risk which could lead to a loss of funds. We recommend the Magistrate deposit funds into the bank by the next business day as required by the Magistrate Manual.
