A. Operations & Maintenance Program

Fauquier County's Stormwater Management Utility Fee funded the County's Environmental Program used in regulating and maintaining Fauquier County Stormwater Management Program. The funds were used to fund staff salaries, benefits and associated expenses for six positions, including a Program Manager, Engineer, Stormwater Management Coordinator and three Inspectors. Associated expenses include training, water quality testing, telecommunications and technology, vehicle maintenance and operation, and similar operating expenses. All of these positions are vital components to the operation and maintenance of the County's Stormwater Management Program.

B. Capital Improvement Program

This program was not funded by the County's Stormwater Utility Fee.
