We are performing a statewide audit of the General District Courts. During our review of this court, we conducted certain audit procedures, as we deemed appropriate.

Management of this court is an important part of the court's accountability since you are responsible for establishing and maintaining internal controls and complying with applicable laws and regulations. During our review, we noted the following matters requiring management's attention and corrective action.

Promptly Deposit Collections

Repeat: No

The former Clerk did not promptly deposit court collections for 13 of 15 days tested (87%) during the audit period. We noted delays of up to four days. Delaying bank deposits increases the risk of loss of funds and has the potential to delay the remittance of state and local funds. The current Clerk should make bank deposits daily as required by the Financial Accounting System User's Guide.

Properly Bill and Collect Court Fines and Costs

Repeat: No

The former Clerk and her staff did not properly bill and collect court fines and costs. In 13 of 68 cases tested (19%), we noted the following errors.

• The former Clerk did not charge defendants in seven cases for a total of \$393 in fines and costs.

- In four cases, the former Clerk miscoded in the financial system fines of \$100 as Commonwealth instead of local and costs of \$120 as local instead of Commonwealth, and erroneously submitted a \$120 invoice for attorney fees to the Commonwealth for payment instead of the locality.
- The former Clerk overcharged defendants in two cases a total of \$90 in costs.

The current Clerk and her staff should correct the specific cases noted above, seek additional training in the billing and collection of fines and costs, and establish a system of review to minimize the likelihood of billing errors going undetected. In all cases, the Clerk should bill and collect court costs in accordance with the Code of Virginia.
